

# Free Project WET/Project Learning Tree Workshop for Green & Healthy School Educators!\*

Project WET is a national interdisciplinary K-12 water education program designed to supplement existing curriculum. Project WET includes over 90 hands-on, water focused activities that were developed in the classroom by teachers. This special workshop will focus on activities for measuring water use and promote water conservation.

Project Learning Tree uses the forest as a “window” on the world to increase students’ understanding of our environment; stimulate students’ critical and creative thinking; develop students’ ability to make informed decisions on environmental issues; and instill in students the commitment to take responsible action on behalf of the environment.
